

# Friends of the Plum Island Light Spring, 2017 Newsletter

#### In memory of Barbara Kezer

On February 23, 2017, the Friends of Plum Island Light lost our friend, our neighbor and our leader Barbara M, Kezer. Barbara was devoted to Plum Island. It was her home and she treasured her memories of the island "as it used to be". As the founder of the Friends of the Plum Island Light, she was committed to the Newburyport Harbor Light's historic importance to the community.

In 1994 the passion and leadership of Barbara Kezer and a small group of island friends established the Friends of Plum Island Light. The Friends have been dedicated to preservation, maintenance and pub-

lic accessibility of the Light ever since. Barbara enjoyed welcoming visitors from around the globe. She especially enjoyed the children that visited and would engage them in conversation to help them understand the importance of lighthouses everywhere.

Barbara never tired of visiting light-houses. In August 2016, she visited the Boston Light. She wanted to write an article about her visit for the newsletter. The following is an excerpt from her notes:

"Just a glorious day enjoyed by Walter and yours truly,

visiting Brewer Island, Boston Harbor, Boston Lighthouse, celebrating 300 years (1716-2016). Walked a short distance to Long Wharf, boarded and enjoyed a 45 minute cruise to Boston Light on one of the cleanest harbors I've ever seen. What a pleasure! Greeted at the dock in colonial garb by USCG Lighthouse keeper Sally Snowman, PHD, the only active lighthouse keeper in the country. "Keeper Snowman" invited three groups of us to the keepers' house for a tour. Each of the three had a relative that served at Boston Light over the last 120 years. I had brought a c. 1904 picture of my grandfather George, his wife, mother and two sons Harlan and Thatcher having a lobster feed next to the Island cannon. She was overjoyed! In return, she gave us an autographed copy of Boston Light A Historical Perspective".

From all the Friends, thank you Barbara for your passion, your sense of humor, your unwavering dedication to Plum Island and the Newburyport Harbor Light. Your legacy lives on.

The Friends are also sad-

demed at the loss of another founder of the Friends. Arthur Woods, who passed away on March 4th. Arthur's contributions to the Friends helped shape the group through it's formative years. We thank Arthur and his family for their long term contributions to preserving the light.

Light House Painting and Window Replacement

In 2016, the Friends were awarded Community Preservation funds from the City of Newburyport to carry out a project to paint the Lighthouse and replace 2 windows. The intent is to provide for continual routine maintenance and stave off future costly repairs. The Friends were awarded up to \$12,000, (including a 20% match).

The Community Preservation Act was implemented in Newburyport in 2002. The Act provides for state and local dollars to fund projects that foster historic preservation, open space, outdoor recreation and/or community housing. The Friends grant application was drafted by members Barbara Kezer and John Vogl. Upon notice of award, the Friends chose the local contracting firm 2Penn, LLC to carry out both tasks. Over the winter, 2Penn carpenter George Penniman replaced the two windows on the ground and landing levels of the lighthouse. The painting project will commence in Spring, 2017. The Friends are also looking into repainting the boat house on site to further preserve that structure.

The Friends are grateful to the Community Preservation Committee for their support for this project, the City of Newburyport for the contribution and 2Penn LLC for their assistance and efforts.
